### [Have a blast at old-fashioned Fourth celebration - The Bakersfield Californian](#)

There are plenty of opportunities to see large fireworks displays this Fourth of July weekend but only one place to see a 31-cannon salute to our country's independence. With firework shows Saturday, Sunday and Monday, Kern County residents can easily make the most of their holiday weekend. The cities of Taft, Shafter and Bakersfield will each host their own evening celebrations, while Tehachapi's festivities go all day. About 38 miles south of Bakersfield, though, something a little different will be going on at Fort Tejon State Historic Park. The Old Time Fourth of July 1856 Celebration will take guests back in time to a year when the first Independence Day wasn't so far in the past — well, 80 years earlier versus 240 years. "The 4th of July celebration at Fort Tejon is unique in itself," said Karina Mooradian, president and chairwoman of the the park's board of directors, in an email. "You are on historic grounds surrounded by nature as it was 160 years ago."
