[Grove and Salas contend that PAGA lawsuits are killing Kern County businesses - 23ABC News](#)

Low oil prices continue to plague Kern County oil companies, but many local businesses are also suffering because of the Private Attorneys General Act (PAGA).



According to the State of California Labor and Workforce Development Agency, PAGA allows "aggrieved employees to file lawsuits to recover civil penalties on behalf of themselves, other employees, and the State of California for Labor Code violations."

Assembly member Shannon Grove of the 34th District says PAGA was created as a revenue source intended to punish bad employers, but now contends the law has been twisted. "Now you have these unscrupulous lawyers out there that are suing on technical violations like dashes, periods, commas," Grove said.
